Board Approves New Assistant Principals for Willowbrook High School

During District 88 Board of Education meeting on May 19, board members voted to approve **Mr. Sam Bentsen and Mrs. Ann Kimpton as the new Assistant Principals of Willowbrook High School**, effective the 2008-2009 school year. They will begin official duties on July 1, 2008.

Since the spring of 1984, the **David Koch Board of Education Scholarship** has been given in honor of former District 88 Superintendent (1974-1983) Dr. David Koch. The \$1,500 scholarship is awarded annually to a student from Addison Trail and Willowbrook. The 2008 recipients are:



Anna Mikulski has demonstrated success in academics and extracurricular activities at Addison Trail. BUILDING THE FUTURE IN DISTRICT 88:

■ Superintendent Dr. Steve Humphrey updated the Board about progress that continues to happen with the relocation of the server room as well as the District Office to the existing Addison Public Library building. Another visible sign of the project was the arrival of the construction trailer on the Addison Trail campus. The communities are invited to participate in groundbreaking celebrations on June 1 at 1:30 for ATHS and 4:00 p.m. for WBHS. These events kick-off construction that is scheduled to begin the week of June 9 following graduation.

THE CONSENT AGENDA, which included the following items, was approved by the Board:

- Recommended **changes to the Student Handbook** including language changes to loitering/trespassing sections.
- Meeting minutes from the Regular Board meeting of April 14, 2008.
- Meeting minutes from the Educational Focus Board meeting of April 21, 2008.

DISCUSION ITEMS REQUIRING NO ACTION:

- Mr. Michael Welch, Assistant. Superintendent for Operations, reported the district is in the process of joining a consortium comprised of up to 78 districts to contract with a single third-party administrator for 403b compliance.
- Mrs. Beth Yacobi, Director of Curriculum and Learning, reported the summer curriculum projects for 2008-09. Staff members from the Science Departments at both schools will review all courses in sequence and the mastery expectations for students. The English Department is moving into year two of this curriculum review process.
- Review of **Revised and Amended Board Policies** 6:160, 6:170, 6:180, 6:190 6:210, 6:230, 6:235, 6:240, 6:250, 6:255, 6:260, 6:270, 6:290, 6:330, and 6:340.
- Ms. Sherri Anderson, Director of Community Relations, described the purpose and process for redesigning the District 88 logo. The timing is appropriate and cost-effective since new letterhead, business cards and other marketing materials will need to be reprinted due to the relocation of the district office.
- Mrs. Jean Barbanente, Director of Learning Services, provided an update on the implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS). District wide, a reduction of 5-10% has been documented in tardies, unexcused absences and other discipline data. District 88 has been commended for having the strongest first year implementation at the high school level statewide.
- A **Freedom of Information Act** request was received and information has been forwarded to Mr. Jim Vodak of Modern Energy Management of Illinois regarding natural gas usage for the last two fiscal years, payments for therms and contracts made with natural gas suppliers.

SCHOOL RECOGNITION:

Addison Trail Principal Dr. Scott Helton highlighted recent events and recognition:

- The annual spring recognition ceremony was hosted to honor student achievements and the retiring staff members.
- Over \$800 was donated to the savedarfur.org organization in the name of Addison Trail as a result of the awareness bracelet sales and BBQ.
- Calvin Cheaney and Nick Ostapa placed in the top ten at the State Gymnastics competition.
- Upcoming events include: Senior Awards Night, Senior Athletic Awards, Yearbook distribution, PBIS Cookout, Prom and Graduation.

Willowbrook Principal Mr. Dan Krause highlighted recent events and recognition:

- "Operation Prom Night" was an informational meeting hosted for parents in conjunction with the Villa Park Police and Fire Departments and the DuPage County State's Attorney's office.
- Nearly 200 students were honored at the Human Relations Breakfast.
- The band and cheerleading squad participated in the annual Lilac Day parade in Lombard.
- Upcoming events include: Willyfest, Senior Carnival, Senior Recognition Awards, Senior Athletic Awards, Prom and Graduation.
