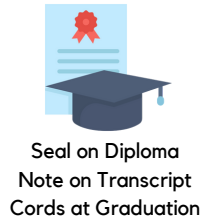

Benefits for Workforce and Career

The demand for bilingual and biliterate employees is expected to increase. Studies have shown:

- 9 out of 10 U.S. employers rely on employees with language skills other than English.
- 56% say their foreign language demand will increase in the next 5 years.
- Employees with language skills earn between 5-20% per hour more than the base rate.

Future Demand for Foreign Language Skills, by Sector

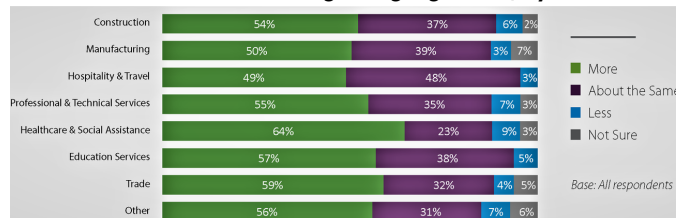

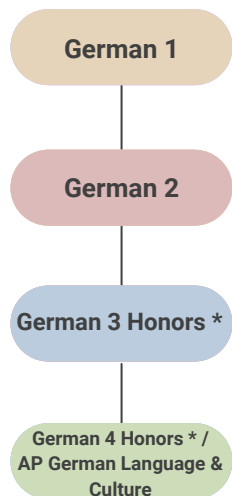

German



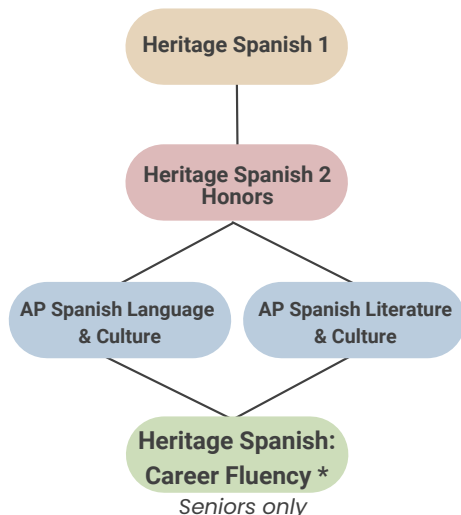
German is the language of international business. It is the second most commonly used scientific language in research and engineering.

Heritage Spanish courses are designed for students who already speak Spanish. The coursework develops Spanish literacy skills and studies Spanish-speaking history and culture.

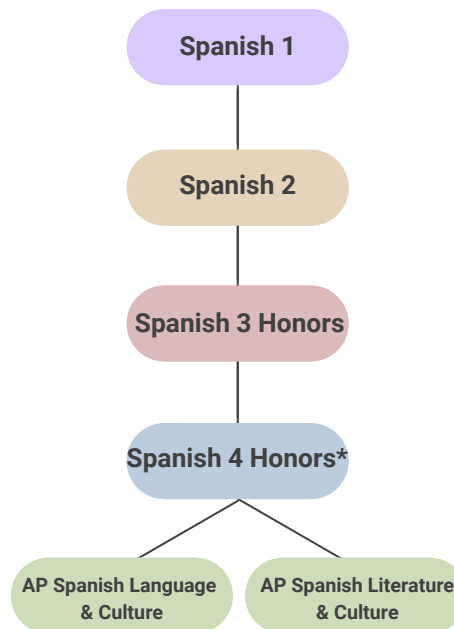


More than 41 million people speak Spanish in the United States and over 500 million people speak Spanish worldwide.
