Behavioral Interventions Committee Recommendations

Mrs. Barbanente discussed changes to the behavior policies for the 2015-16 school year, which were recommended by the Behavioral Interventions Committee. Credit Card Summary

Mr. Edward Hoster, Chief Financial Officer, reviewed the district's credit card use report for April 2015, as outlined in Board Policy 4:55, Use of Credit and Procurement Cards.



The Board discussed a modification in procedure with regard to all facility-related projects. During its April meeting, the Buildings & Grounds Committee discussed and agreed to follow the more informal practice of "request for written quotations" in lieu of soliciting formal bids for projects under \$50,000. This practice will allow the District to still solicit multiple bidders while keeping the cost for pre-bid work to a minimum.
