Guidance Directors Kevin Redding (AT) and Cathy Bendicsen (WB) and Curriculum and Instruction Assistant Principals Adam Cibulka (AT) and Ann Kimpton (WB) presented initiatives on the course selection process as well as financial aid and scholarship assistance opportunities. The course selection process begins with the graduation requirements and school code. Courses are broken down into 1) prescribed courses, recommended based on test scores, teacher recommendation and past performance and 2) elective courses, based on college requirements, career choices and interest. The Guidance Department has increased opportunities for students and their parents to learn more about course options and meet with guidance counselors during the selection process.

The financial aid assistance has included additional workshops, group and individual FAFSA guidance and tax assistance. Scholarship information is advertised in the Guidance office, student bulletin, school website and local cable channel. Financial aid offices from individual schools also offer scholarship opportunities.
