Recognition of District 88 Successes

88's Best Students

88's Best Students <u>Jessica Mell</u> from Addison Trail and <u>Galen Bergsten</u> from Willowbrook were honored for the month of October. The students were recognized for their many accomplishments. The students thanked the Board, their teachers and their families for the support. ♦ Educational Focus Items

District 88's Data Summary & 2015-16 ISBE Assessment Updates

Mr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, shared information on District 88's student growth in reading and math, reduction in behavior incidents, graduation rate, enrollment in Advanced Placement (AP)/college-level courses and assessment performance. The 2014-15 5Essentials Survey revealed students gave high ratings on topics relating to teachers and student learning, school safety, respect and preparing students for college.

The updates for the 2015-16 PARCC Assessment include: only one assessment (last year there were two) to be administered between March and May; reduction in testing time (60 minutes less in math and 30 minutes less in English language arts); and administer same assessment as in 2014-15, which for District 88 was ELA I and Algebra I. The all-school assessment will possibly be postponed for 2015-16. The State has not released information regarding ACT or SAT. The district is exploring other options for the April 9, 2016, National Test date at ATHS or WBHS, and prep opportunities will be available for students. Incoming students will take the EXPLORE and GRADE (a reading diagnostic assessment) exams. The State's science assessment will be administered in spring 2016.

Tax Levy 2015

Mr. Edward Hoster, Chief Financial Officer, presented information regarding the upcoming tax levy process. He also presented the 2015 Tax Levy schedule and said he would bring a resolution for the tax levy for the board to adopt at its next meeting, November 16, 2015.

Thermal Scanning of Electrical Equipment Project

Mr. Hoster shared the 10-year Health/Life Safety Report completed in March 2015 revealed that a portion of the buildings' electrical distribution system is approaching the end of its usefulness. The district conducted a Request for Proposals (RFP) to conduct infrared thermal scanning of the electrical distribution system panels at each school. The lowest responsible proposal for both schools was received from TSI Energy Solutions in the amount of \$7,400. The proposal was approved by the Buildings and Grounds Committee.
