Recognition of District 88 Successes

88's Best Students

88's Best Students <u>Zachary Tyler Novak</u> from Addison Trail and <u>Stephaney Cheng</u> from Willowbrook were recognized for the month of September. The students were congratulated on their many accomplishments, and they thanked the Board, their teachers and their families for their support. As a token of their achievements, Zachary and Stephaney were given an 88's Best glass sculpture and a certificate.

Public Hearing on the Budget for 2015-16

A public hearing took place on the budget for 2015-16.

Mr. Edward Hoster, Chief Financial Officer, reported the projected deficit for the tentative budget as of June was at \$1,987,426, and the final budget reflects a deficit of \$1,847,054. Mr. Hoster further gave an overview of changes in the final budget from June. Those changes included a decrease in revenue from property taxes, state and federal programs. The expenditure budget decreased overall, with final student enrollment and staffing driving most of the related changes. The final budget reflects a minor increase in revenue by \$33,520 over the prior year budget. The district's expenditure plan reflects an increase of \$19,000 over the prior year budget. Significant constraint was necessary throughout the budgeting process to minimize the use of financial reserves.

Educational Focus Items

Concussion Protocol

Mr. Bob Daly, Willowbrook Athletic Director, and Mr. Matt Thompson, Addison Trail Athletic Director, presented on Senate Bill 07. That bill amends the School Code and repeals provisions of the Code concerning concussions and head injuries and student-athletes. Daly and Thompson informed the Board the schools have had similar protocols in place to ensure student safety, and the only new aspect for the schools under Senate Bill 07 is formalizing a concussion oversight team to establish a return-to-play protocol for a student's return to interscholastic athletics practice or competition following a force or impact believed to have caused a concussion. They outlined who is part of that team and the process and protocols that are in place at the schools.

<u>Special Education Inclusion Update</u>

Mr. Sam Bentsen, District 88 Director of Student Services, shared information about District 88's initiatives to ensure special education students are included in extracurricular sports and programs. Bentsen discussed guidance provided by the Office for Civil Rights, which states students with disabilities must be afforded the opportunity to benefit from the programs offered by the school district to all students; school districts should not make generalizations when determining the participation level of those students; and school districts should provide needed accommodations, modifications and supports for those students (as long as it does not fundamentally alter the program). Bentsen informed the Board the district is in compliance with regard to special education inclusion, and many special education students participate in District 88 sports and activities, including Special Olympics teams.

Villa Park Intergovernmental Agreement: The Village of Villa Park requested District 88 provide the street address and phone number (no names) of Villa Park residents who attend District 88, so the village could contact them with emergency notifications. The Board asked several questions regarding the agreement to ensure they understood the request. Those questions included whether the district was providing similar information to the Village of Villa Park already; whether other school districts in Villa Park have agreed to provide this information to the village; whether the village has another way to collect the requested information; whether parents could opt out if they prefer not to have their information shared with the village; and whether the district has a similar agreement with the Village of Addison.

Credit Card Summary

Mr. Hoster reviewed the district's credit card use report for August 2015, as outlined in Board Policy 4:55 Use of Credit and Procurement Cards.

Salary Compensation Reports

Mrs. Jean Barbanente, Assistant Superintendent, reported the Salary Compensation Reports are required in Illinois. Those reports are to be posted on the district's website and submitted to the Regional Superintendent and/or the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).

Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel Services

Mr. Hoster presented information regarding the engagement of Chapman & Cutler LLC to provide specialized legal services throughout the upcoming bond refunding and new issuance process. Ensuring conformity with all current legal requirements and providing a legal opinion is critical to the outcome of this potential bond issuance process. Chapman & Cutler LLC has provided these services for the bond issuance undertaken by the Board of Education in the past.




Willowbrook
