Recognition of District 88 Success

88's Best Students

Mr. Krause introduced Colin White, Willowbrook student and Dr. Helton introduced Sara Tomasello, Addison Trail student who were honored as 88's Best for the month of February. The students were congratulated on their many accomplishments. The students thanked the board, their teachers and their families for their support. As a token of their achievements, Colin and Sara were given an 88's Best glass sculpture, certificate and a gift card to Stir Crazy Restaurant.

Student Recognition

Dr. Humphrey reported on a story that was shared through the Special Association for Special Education (SASED) and the Herald-News, where Shelley McGrath-Myers was honored for her spirit and strength. Shelley is an Addison Trail student, enrolled in a program for visually impaired students through SASED. Although Shelley is blind, she has high expectations and plans to go to Illinois State University.

EDUCATIONAL FOCUS ITEMS

Illinois State Board of Education Focus Monitoring Update on Special Education

Jean Barbanente discussed the structures that have been created by District 88 to allow for more Special Education students to have access to general education environments with supports, including co-teaching models in the core academic areas for freshmen, sophomores and juniors. During the 2009-10 school year, less than 20 percent of Special Education students were spending 80 percent or more of their time in the general education curriculum. As of December 2011, that percentage has moved to more than 44 percent.

Summer School Update

Jean Barbanente reviewed summer course options for this year. Speech and Consumer Management will be offered at both campuses; Geometry will be offered for Willowbrook and Addison Trail students on the Addison Trail campus; Summer School Interventions will be offered for incoming Freshmen students who need skill remediation in the areas of Reading and Math, and for upperclassmen who need Credit Recovery; and Special Education Extended School Year summer programs will be provided on campus for students in the Transition, DLP and LINK programs. Registration began in February.

Update on Progress Monitoring – School Improvement Process

Jean Barbanente reported District 88 uses a systemic approach to district improvement to ensure all work in the district is focused on opportunities for students to achieve at the highest levels with the appropriate supports. Comprehensive school reform is not only about test scores, but encompasses all aspects of achievement-academic as well as social emotional. School Improvement in the district is organized into six categories: Curriculum Alignment, Assessment Practices, Instructional Strategies, Behavior Intervention, Social Emotional Learning and Parent Involvement. Through this approach, District 88 has seen great success including the expansion of Advanced Placement and honors programming, increased graduation rates, dramatically decreased discipline incidents and more personalization for students and parents across the school environment.
