Dr. Peter Krogh Class: 1971




- Graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1975 with distinction




Tom Lambke Class: 1973

Glenn Lid Class: 1975




- Graduated from Elmhurst College in 1979 with highest honors

Victor Salvo Jr. Class: 1975




Accomplishments:
