Greetings,

This spring, high schools across Illinois have begun administering new assessments created through the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC). The PARCC assessments are online, computer-based assessments focused on measuring student critical thinking and problem-solving skills in two major areas: English language arts (ELA) and math.

The PARCC assessments replace both the Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) in elementary schools and the Prairie State Achievement Exam (PSAE) in high schools. For high school students, the PARCC assessments are designed for specific courses, not grade levels. At the high school level, districts have been given the flexibility by the state this year to choose one of the following three combinations:

(1) ELA 1 and Algebra 1 ELA 1 = English 9 (2) ELA 2 and Geometry ELA 2 = English 10 (3) ELA 3 and Algebra 2 ELA 3 = English 11

This year, DuPage High School District 88 has chosen to administer the PARCC assessments to the following course groups: *ELA 1 (English 9) and Algebra 1*. You are receiving this letter because your student is enrolled in one or more courses aligned to ELA 1 (English 9) and/or Algebra 1 course groupings.

Your student most likely took the Performance Based Assessment; in two weeks, your student will take the End of Year (EOY) assessment. Each PARCC component has multiple test units/sessions which are listed below with the approximate time to complete each unit/session. Schools are to administer the PBA assessment when approximately 75% of instruction has occurred in the course and the EOY when approximately 90% of instruction has occurred in the course.

Tuesday, May 19, and Wednesday, May 20, we will begin administering the PARCC - EOY assessments to all students enrolled in ELA 1 (English 9) and Algebra 1 courses.
