Essay Contest Questions

High School Questions: 9th - 12th Grade

"Game Changer" is a phrase that is being used across the world in all industries and areas of life. A Game Changer is seen as a person, idea, or event that significantly changes the way something is done, thought of, or acted upon. The NAACP also has five 21st Century Game Changer Initiatives:

Economic Sustainability Education Health Public Safety and Criminal Justice Voting Rights and Political Representation

Choose at least <u>one</u> of the initiatives and write a 500 to 750 word essay in which you analyze how (your chosen initiatives) will encourage you to be a Game Changer in your home, school and community today.

Middle School Question: 6th - 8th Grade

A successful education requires collaboration between parents, teachers, students and administrators. Write a 350 to 500-word essay explaining how a successful collaboration is accomplished and in particular stress what role you play.
