



A center fleider, Kelso led the WIAC in hits (69), battling average (.442), slugging percentage (.782), on-base percentage (.532) and stolen bases (27) during the 2021 season. He finished second in the conference in runs scored (55), total bases (122), doubles (18) and triples (4). Kelso finished fourth in the conference in home runs (9). Kelso recorded a hit in 36 of 41 games in which he played. He recorded 25 multi-hit games and delivered a 13-game hitting streak during the season. He closed the year with a 10-game hitting streak Kelso was the errors in 115 defensive chances. Kelso entered the 2022 season as the UW-Platteville program's all-time leader in career hits (197). He has a chance to set all-time program records in at-bats, runs scored, doubles, triples, runs batted in, total bases and stolen bases.
