# **Addison to receive County Stormwater Management ARPA**

DuPage County's Stormwater DuPage County's Stormwater Management Department accepted grant proposals from municipalities for flood control and water quality projects countywide. The selected projects will be partially funded using an allocation of DuPage County's American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) funding from the federal government.
